e Interrelated Dimensions of Music (Dimensions) DRIVER WORDS:

ulse – the regular heartbeat of the music; its steady beat.

thythm – long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.

itch – high and low sounds.

empo – the speed of the music; fast or slow or in-between.

lynamics - how loud or quiet the music is.

imbre – all instruments, including voices, have a certain sound quality e.g. the pet has a very different sound quality to the violin.

- Texture layers of sound. Layers of sound working together make music very interesting to listen to.
- Structure every piece of music has a structure e.g. an introduction, verse and chorus ending.
- Notation the link between sound and symbol.
