# Our Subject Learning This Week

Reception	We have been developing our counting and number sequencing skills.
Year 1	In Science this week, we have been naming the parts of the body and thinking about the role of each part.
Year 2	In History, we have enjoyed learning about The Great Fire of London. We used our Literacy skills to write our own newspaper report about The Great Fire of London.
Year 3	In PE, we looked at how to be defenders and attackers in Tag Rugby.

#### Racial Justice, Equality and Diversity

Over the last two weeks, we have been exploring racial justice across our school. All pupils completed a reflection and added their thumbprint to postcards produced and coordinated by St Mary's, Bishops Stortford. 
